ESSENTIAL AGREEMENTS

Classroom Essential Agreements: Each year, our students and teachers work together to create Essential Agreements for their classrooms and learning spaces. This is a collaborative process where everyone has a voice, helping to build positive, supportive environments where students feel safe, respected and ready to learn.

Once the agreements are finalised, they will be sent home and included in your child's portfolio—so keep an eye out for them!

This year, we continue to build on our Positive Classroom Management Strategies, as recommended by the Department of Education and Training (DET). These strategies help make expectations clear and consistent, supporting student learning, wellbeing and engagement. We really appreciate your support in reinforcing these expectations as we work together to create a thriving school community.

Playground Essential Agreement

Over the coming weeks, each grade will have the opportunity to revisit and discuss the school's Playground Essential Agreement. This annual process ensures that student voice is central, with ideas gathered collaboratively across the school.

The finalised 2026 Playground Agreement will be shared in the school newsletter and displayed around the school for everyone to see.

SRC (Student Representative Council)

Soon, students will begin the process of nominating and voting for their class **SRC representative**. The role and responsibilities will be clearly explained to students, as it is an important position of leadership and service.

SRC representatives will work closely with **The Green Team**, taking on the role of *Eco-Warriors* and supporting our ResourceSmart initiatives, including Waste, Water, Energy and Biodiversity.



STUDENT PORTFOLIOS

Students will begin creating their student portfolios, which capture their learning journey and progress over time. These portfolios will be shared with families during open classroom visits and at our Celebration of Learning Assemblies (dates can be found in the Diary Dates section of this newsletter).

A portfolio is a celebration of an active mind at work. It showcases growth, creativity, higher-order thinking, reflection and assessment evidence. Portfolios support meaningful conversations between students, teachers and families, helping identify strengths, areas for growth and future learning goals.

BEGINNING THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR BOOKLETS

Families will receive a hard copy of the Beginning of the Year Parent Information Booklet. This includes an overview of when each Unit of Inquiry will begin and end throughout the year, helping you stay connected to your child's learning. Specialist teachers will also share information about their programs.

From this point on, school communication will be shared electronically via Compass.

GETTING TO KNOW YOU INTERVIEWS February 5 and 10

Parents of students in the Junior, Middle and Senior School (Years 1–6) are invited to book a Getting to Know You Interview with their child's new teacher. These bookings are available on Compass, and we strongly encourage families to take up this opportunity. If these times do not work for you, please contact your child's teacher to arrange an alternative time. You may wish to share information such as:



- Your child's strengths
- Languages spoken at home
- Any health, medical or learning needs
- Recent assessments (e.g. speech, OT, vision, hearing)
- Any concerns about learning or wellbeing
- Family circumstances that may impact your child
- Extra-curricular activities your child enjoys

This information helps us support your child in the best possible way.

PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Our next Parent–Teacher Interviews will be held on **23 and 25 June**, a student-free day. Families will be invited to book a 15-minute time slot via Compass.

Parents may choose whether or not to bring their child to the meeting. While we encourage student attendance, we understand that families have different preferences and appreciate the feedback shared last year.

CONCERNS AND PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS

Should you ever have concerns about your child's learning or wish to discuss their progress in more detail, please don't hesitate to book a meeting with your child's teacher. This can be done at any time throughout the year—there's no need to wait for scheduled parent-teacher sessions. We believe that education is a collaborative partnership between parents, school, and students, and open communication is key to supporting each child's individual needs. Remember, your involvement in your child's education is invaluable, and we appreciate your ongoing commitment to their success.

RESOURCE SMART SCHOOLS



Ms Nutbean, our Science Teacher, continues to lead our ResourceSmart Schools journey. We have proudly achieved two stars so far and we are now working towards our third star, focusing on energy. Please see Ms Nutbean's report later in the newsletter for more details.

LIBRARY

Our library is open for borrowing, and we strongly encourage students to borrow regularly—both fiction and non-fiction. Reading is a vital lifelong skill, and literature helps students make sense of the world around them.

Prep, Year 1 and Year 2: Please have a name library bag to protect the books, when carrying to and from school. This can be any type of bag eg: drawstring, shopping bag, tote. Etc.



Parents and carers can support reading at home by listening to children read, reading to them, and reading together. Students will bring home books matched to their reading level, while library books are student-selected and may need some guidance.

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Privacy Collection Notice

Information for students, parents and carers

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) values your privacy and is committed to protecting the personal and health information that schools collect.

All school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law and the [Schools' Privacy Policy](#). This notice explains how the Department, including Victorian government schools (schools), handles personal and health information. On occasion, specific consent will be sought for the collection and use of information, for example, for a student to receive a health service. Our schools are also required by legislation, such as the *Education and Training Reform Act 2006*, to collect some of this information.

Throughout this notice, staff includes principals, teachers, student support service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners, and all other employees, contractors, volunteers and service providers of the school and the Department.

On enrolment, and during the ordinary course of a student's attendance at a school, schools will collect information about students and their families for the following purposes:

- educating students
- supporting students' social and emotional wellbeing, and health
- fulfilling legal obligations, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law
- communicating and engaging with parents
- student administration
- school management
- supporting policy in relation to student education and wellbeing.

If this information is not collected, schools may be unable to provide optimal education or support to students or fulfil legal obligations.

For example, our schools rely on parents to provide **health information** about any medical condition or disability that their child has, medication their child may take while at school, any known allergies and contact details of their child's doctor. If parents do not provide all relevant health information, this may put their child's health at risk.

Our schools also require current, relevant information about all **parents and carers** so that schools can take account of safety concerns that affect their children. Parents should provide schools with copies of all current parenting plans and court orders about or that affect their children and provide updated copies when they change.

When parents enrol their child in primary school, they will be asked to provide personal and health information in several ways, including via the Enrolment Form, the [School Entrance Health Questionnaire](#) (SEHQ) and the [Early Childhood Intervention Service](#) (ECIS) Transition Form.

The **Enrolment Form** is used to collect information that is essential for the purposes listed above, and requests information such as:

- **Emergency contacts** – Individuals parents nominate for a school to contact during an emergency. Parents should ensure that their nominated emergency contact agrees to their contact details being provided to the school and that they understand their details may be disclosed by the Department if lawful, e.g. in the case of emergency communications relating to bush fires or floods.
- **Student background information** – Information about country of birth, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin, language spoken at home and parent occupation. This information enables the Department to allocate appropriate resources to schools. The Department also uses this information to plan for future educational needs in Victoria and shares some information with the Commonwealth government to monitor, plan and allocate resources.

- **Immunisation status** – This assists schools to manage health risks and legal obligations. The Department may also provide this information to the Department of Health and Department of Families, Fairness and Housing to assess immunisation rates in Victoria, but not in a way which identifies students.
- **Visa status** – This is required to process a student's enrolment.

All schools may use departmental systems and online tools such as apps and other software to effectively collect and manage information about students and families for the purposes listed above.

When schools use these online tools, they take steps to ensure that student information is secure. If parents or carers have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact the school.

School staff will only share student and family information with other school staff who need to know to enable them to educate or support the student as described above. Information will only be shared outside the school (and outside the Department) as required or authorised by law, including where sharing is required to meet duty of care, anti-discrimination, occupational health and safety, and child wellbeing and safety obligations. The information collected will not be disclosed beyond the school and Department without parent consent unless such disclosure is lawful.

When a student transfers to another school (including Catholic, independent and interstate), personal and/or health information about that student may be transferred to the next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of the student and assists the next school to provide the best possible education and support to the student. For further detail about how and what level of information is provided to the next school, refer to the: [Enrolment: Student transfers between schools](#)

Schools only provide school reports and ordinary school communications to students, parents, carers or others who have a legal right to that information. Requests for access to other student information or by others must be made by lodging a [Freedom of Information](#) (FOI) application.

To update student or family information, parents should contact their school.

OFFICE NEWS

Compass - It is essential that you access your Compass regularly to keep up to date and informed about upcoming events for your child along with newsletters and relevant news.

Emergency Contacts - If your child needs to be collected by someone other than yourself or your listed emergency contacts, please send an email to the office with the person's name and details, as per department guidelines.

Personal Property - Students should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school as the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development does not hold insurance for personal property brought to school and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property. Personal property includes such items as mobile phones, calculators, toys sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. All student mobile phones are to be handed into the office for safe keeping during the day.

Tissues and paper towel request – At the start of each year we kindly request if families could be supply their child/ren's class with a box of tissues and a packet of paper towel. This is greatly appreciated.

Medication - All medication required during the school day must be handed in to the front office and be in their original packaging/box. If your child is taking Panadol or antibiotics, you will need to complete a medical permission form at the office each time you require them to do so.

Working with Children Card - Parent/Grandparent/Carer helpers are reminded that a valid WWC is required before volunteering at HPPS for all events, including incursions, excursions and camps. Volunteer Working with Children Cards are free. See link below to apply.
