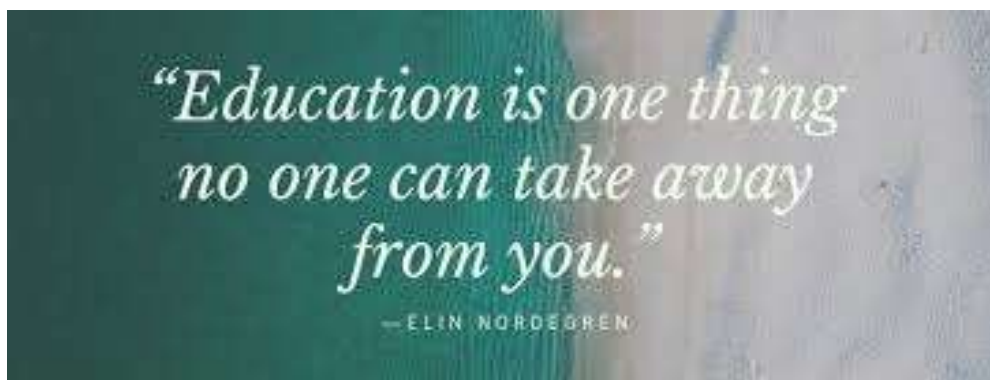

From the Acting Principal's Desk

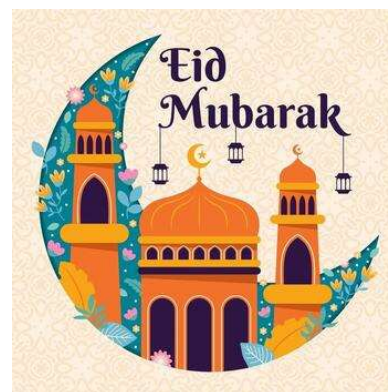


On behalf of the staff at HPPS, I would like to extend my warmest wishes to all our families celebrating **Eid al-Fitr**.

From the Wellbeing Leader's Desk

Every day Counts!

Going to school every day is an important part of your child's education, wellbeing and development. Children and young people learn new things at school every day, connect with friends, have fun and develop good habits that help them to succeed. Attending and participating in school will help your child:

- develop important skills and knowledge to help them learn
- develop social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and teamwork
- establish friendships with peers which help develop self-esteem and a sense of belonging.

There is no good number of days for missing school. **Being away from school for 1 day a fortnight adds up to missing 4 whole weeks of school a year.** Where possible, you should avoid your child missing school, for example, make appointments for your child outside of school hours and keep family holidays to outside term time.



Attending school every day means experiencing what counts - the learning, friendships, fun and opportunities that can shape their future.

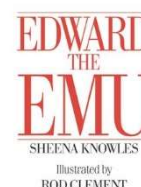
In our English block this term, we have been developing our reading and writing skills through text studies.



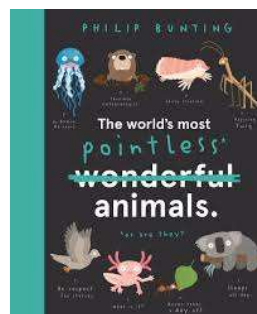
Grade 1 began the year with a pair of picture books focused on friendship: *The Boy who Tried to Shrink his Name* by Sandhya Parappukkaran and *Two Mates* by Melanie Prewett. They identified character emotions and discussed how books can have an underlying message.



Currently, the Grade 1s are exploring *Edward the Emu* by Rod Clement and *Fish is Fish* by Leo Lionni. These fantastic picture books have been a treasure trove of new words to help build student vocabulary. They have also provided plenty of opportunities to learn about all the different types of verbs: thinking, doing, saying and feeling. Students have also been practising understanding character emotions and perspectives.



In Grade 2, we have been learning about information reports with guidance from Philip Bunting's amazing book *The world's most pointless animals*. Students had heaps of fun learning about a variety of strange animals, including the three-toed sloth ("slowcus pokeus") and pufferfish ("veriverius defensivus"). Then, they created information reports of their own that were full of facts and even had a labelled diagram of their chosen animal.

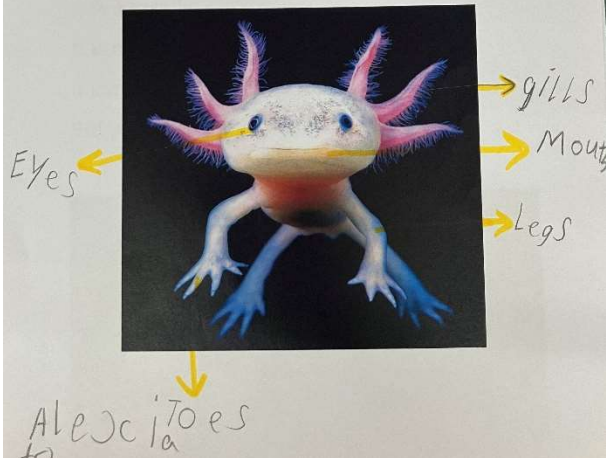

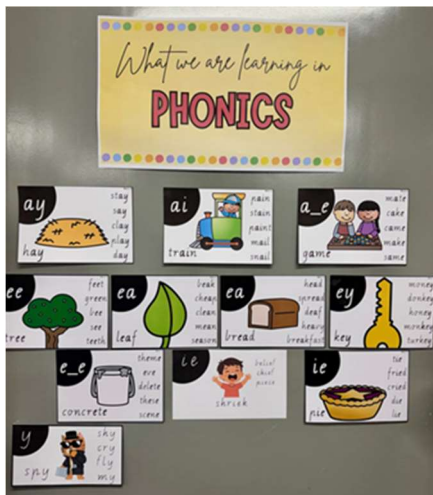


PHONICS and GRAMMAR

In our Junior classrooms, students are building their reading and spelling skills through the ARC phonics program in engaging ways. Year 1 students are working through Sets 14–16, learning more complex sounds (such as ie, igh, y and split digraphs like i_e) and how endings like -ed, -s and -es change words. In Year 2, students are extending these skills in Sets 27 and 28 by exploring more advanced spelling patterns and longer words. Across both year levels, there is a strong focus on building confidence in using phonics for reading and writing.

Students regularly revise and practice these skills through games, small group work and targeted support, helping them become more fluent and independent learners.

In Grammar, both Year 1 and Year 2 students have been working through the first 10 ARC lessons, learning the basics of sentence structure. They are focusing on nouns, verbs, capital letters and full stops, helping them to write clear sentences and express their ideas with confidence.



Maths

This term, students in Grade 1 and Grade 2 have been building their confidence and skills in math's through a range of engaging activities using the ARC program and Math's daily reviews to start the lessons each day.

Students have been learning to recognise numbers quickly and understand how numbers can be combined to help solve addition problems. They have also been practicing counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, and exploring number patterns by finding missing numbers and creating their own patterns.

Grade 1 students have been working with numbers up to 120, while Grade 2 students have been extending this to numbers up to 1000.

Students have also explored simple mapping and directions, using language such as left, right, forwards and backwards above, behind, under and over.

It has been wonderful to see students growing in confidence, trying new strategies, and persisting when faced with challenges.





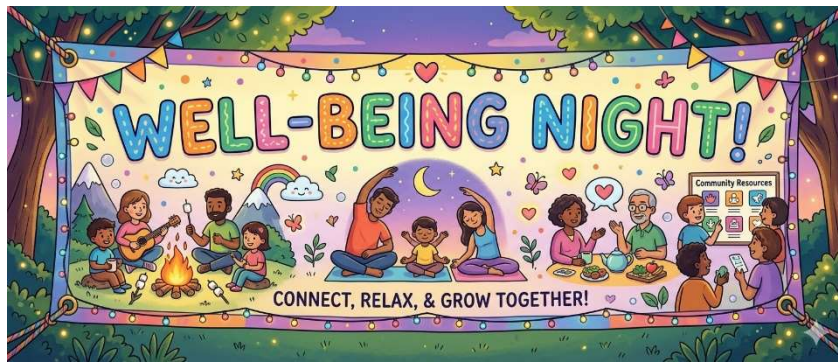
In our Unit of Inquiry, we have been learning about what activities keep us healthy. We learnt about the importance of our emotions with the Mindful Monkey. We now know how to slow down and breathe when things get big, how to notice body clues, name our emotions, and choose a safe way to express our feelings and how to use our senses to stay grounded and calm.

We talked about food that we should eat every day and foods that we should only eat sometimes and ordered ourselves holding a food item according to how often we should eat it.



Students discussed what is a healthy choice for our body, for example drinking water, playing sport and getting enough sleep and what is a poor health choice for our body, for example playing video games too much and arguing with friends.

When learning about what and who is a reliable source of information and what and who isn't, students learnt the importance of who is trustworthy, for example doctors and non-fiction books, and who and what is not a reliable source of information for example YouTubers and tv ads.



On Wednesday the 18th of March, we had our Junior School Wellbeing night! Thank you so much to all the students and families who came, it was a wonderful night full of family, friendship and emotional wellbeing.
